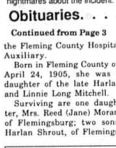

According to the fire department report, the occupants were outside when they arrived. Since the doors were all locked, the firemen forced entry through a door. The firemen removed from the house the deep fat fryer and the rug in the kitchen that had ignited. A power ventilator was used to assist the remaining smoke from the house. Tommy Crawford, Carlisle City Fire Chief, said, "A smoke detector being present was a major factor in four lives being saved. A few more minutes and things could have turned out completely different." "A smoke detector is so inexpensive to purchase, but it saved our lives," E. Dale said. The family was taken to Nicholas County Hospital where they spent the night, the report said.

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
