However, with only a gain of three yards by running back Raymond Brown, the Jackets were forced to punt the ball away.

Problems in the Jacket secondary emerged to give the Colonels two first downs before a pass rush forced Ferrell to ground the ball or take a loss.

But the Colonels' onslaught would not remain stalled. Running back Eric Toubey busted two Jacket defensive men on a sweep that resulted in the Colonels' first score. The kick for the extra point went wide, leaving the Jackets trailing 6-0.

ORDINANCE NO. 6, 1991

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE PROPERTY AD VALOREM TAX RATE OF THE CITY OF CARLSLE AT SEVENTEEN (0.17) CENTS PER ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) DOLLAR VALUATION TO BE USED FOR GENERAL FUND PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLSLE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: An ad valorem tax of seventeen (0.17) cents on each one hundred (\$100.00) dollars worth of property is hereby levied on all lands, improvements, and personal property with exception to motor vehicles and watercrafts tangible or intangible, held or owned by any person, firm, company, corporation or association in law, here, there, or it name, or a fiduciary or agency and subject to taxation under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

SECTION II: Where applicable property values used will be those set by the County Property Valuation Administrator, or by such other authority as the City Council may provide.

SECTION III: All of such taxes shall be paid to the Clerk or Treasurer of the City of Carlsle for General Fund purposes.

SECTION IV: All 1991 taxes paid by October 31, 1991 will be allowed a Two (2) Percent Discount. All 1991 taxes not paid before January 1, 1992 shall be assessed a Six (6) Percent Penalty. In addition, interest at the legal rate shall be assessed on all delinquent taxes.
