Farmers not receiving fair share

The remaining part of the 1991 crop is going to the market, Phillips said it is too early to make a final assessment of the success of the 1991 crop.

Due to a serious outbreak of tobacco disease such as black shank and, in some cases, root rot, there are some producers in Nicholas County who will most likely come in short on their average yield this year, Phillips said.

Buyers seem to put a higher price on graded tobacco than on those that have been stripped all the way down and combined, he said.

Phillips said it would be different for farmers if the higher prices buyers were offering for graded tobacco were extended. But the few cents difference between graded and combined tobacco does not justify or offset the additional labor costs to the farmer.

In essence, tobacco producers receive about the same or less spendable income for their product whether they grade or not, Phillips said.

Lane said, "We will not accept paint, tires, or motor oil. There will be a charge for anything like this found in the containers. The person in hand to work there will have to monitor the garbage which is put in the containers."
