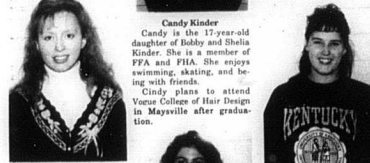

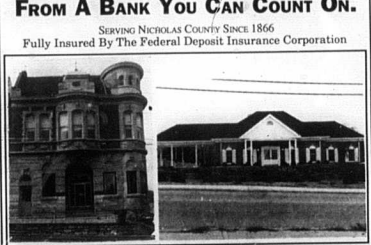
Margo Segal
