Lady Jackets' rally falls short

CARLE - The Nicholas County Lady Jackets rallied for seven of 30 shots, and never saw the lead.
 Nicholas County lost for only the fourth time in 22 contests.
 The Defenders from Bryan Station made the first basket, but Kim Dennis tied it up for the early 2-3 score.
 Tamra Higgins rattled off two straight Defenders' scores before Renee Loville could get free for a jump shot at the 4:12 mark.
 Bryan Station ran out to a 12-4 lead before Nicholas County coach Barbara Kenney called time out with 2:54 left in the first quarter.

After the break, Elizabeth Schanding scored on a leading jumper in the lane, but the Defenders held on to the lead. Tiffany Henderson added two chip shots and Higgins came on Earlwyne's layup with 1:20 that broke the 1000 point barrier.
 The Lady Jackets went into the break trailing by a score of 30-14.
 Nicholas County came out and scored the first five points after intermission, capped off by Dennis' layup and free throw, but the Defenders kept pace.
 Higgins led the charge, as Bryan Station out scored Nicholas County 10-4 over the next four minutes. The Defenders held the lead 40-36.

The Lady Jackets pulled within five points three times in the final 1:30 of the game, but the Defenders hit seven of eight free throws to hold off Nicholas County.
 Dennis pulled the Jackets within four, 58-54, with only 17 seconds left, but Nicholas County could not get closer.
 The four teams traded baskets until the final 1:30 of the game, when Kim Dennis hit a game-winning jumper to open the fourth quarter.
 "We were playing a team that Division AAA, and we were just scored. The second quarter, with Kim on the bench, really killed us," Dennis led the Jackets in scoring with 23 points, and also getting on the books for Nicholas County with a score of 52-48.
 Christie Hutton spurred the Jackets even closer with a layup and assist for a 53-47 margin and another Defenders point.
