An ORDINANCE AMENDING 471.21 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ADD A SECOND REGULAR MEETING EACH MONTH ON THE FOURTH MONDAY AND TO CHANGE THE TIME OF MEETINGS TO 7:00 P.M. Be it Ordained by the City of Carlisle: § 1. That §32.21 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Carlisle be and hereby is amended to read as follows: (A) (1) Each City Council shall hold its first meeting at 7:00 p.m. on the first Monday succeeding the municipal election at which the members of the Council have been elected, at the city offices. (2) Regular meetings of the City Council shall be held thereafter at 7:00 p.m. on the second and fourth Monday of each month at the city offices. (3) In the event the meeting day falls on a legal holiday or is otherwise inconvenient, the Council may by majority vote at a prior meeting schedule the meeting. (B) Special meetings of the Council may be called by the Mayor or upon written request of a majority of the Council. In the call, the Mayor or Council shall designate the purpose, time, and place of the special meeting with sufficient notice for the attendance of councilmembers and for compliance with KRS Chapter 61. (C) At a special meeting no business may be considered other than that set forth in the designation of purpose. (D) The minutes of every meeting shall be signed by the person responsible for maintaining city records as provided under §31.36 and by the officer presiding at the meeting. (KRS §3A.110 (1)) (E) All meetings of City Council shall be public. (Ord. 2-1980, passed 1-12-81) (F) The presiding officer shall keep order at all Council meetings, and any person who is guilty of disorderly conduct at a Council meeting shall, upon conviction, be subject to the penalties provided in §10.99. (Ord. 2A, passed - -) § 2. That the ordinance shall become effective upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
