Harrison stunned in loss to NCHS

CARLSLE — In the midst of five game homestand...

Nicholas County was off to the races to open the third quarter, allowing Nicholas County only two shots at the basket in the quarter's first two minutes while running off nine straight points to lead 35-28 with 5:56 to play.

The Bluejackets took a 6-4 lead with 5:02 to play in the opening quarter when Daniel Brown grabbed a rebound and drove the length of the court for a layup.

It was a long dry spell for the Jackets, though and Harrison County ran off 10 unanswered points to lead 44-47 with 1:13 left in the quarter. With 40 seconds left in the quarter, Harrison County began a third to hold the ball for a last shot.

With five seconds to play in the quarter, Jody Crump was selected for an illegal screen turning the ball over to Nicholas County. The Jackets moved the ball into front court and Daniel Brown took the hoop with one second left and was hammered on the shot by Chris Beffitt.

Brown's two free throw shots in the quarter ending score at 44-48 Harrison County. Nicholas County quickly fell behind 12:30 before finding its own offense.

Brian Hillander hit the first six points in the quarter, and with 6:10 to play in the first, Nicholas County had cut the Harrison lead to 17-14.

Kris Reitz kept Harrison County in the lead, and with 1:49 to play in the half his layup gave the Thunderd 26-21 lead.

David Sibert nailed a three point basket from the right corner, and Hillander cannot to six shots on the baseline to lift the homesteading Jackets to a 29-28 lead at intermission.

The Jackets led 45-41, but a delay of game technical foul was called on the Jackets, and Reitz cannot both free throws to give the Thunderd 46-41 and the ball.

Harrison County failed to answer on the possession and only a free throw with 5:28 to go in the game added to the Thunderd's advantage.

Sims hit in the lane with 5:29 left in the game and the score 47-41. Harrison came back to move on the possession and only a free throw with 5:47 left in the game.

Hillander scored two straight from the line to tie the game 49-41, but Reitz kept the Thunderd close hitting five of four charity throws the second tying the score at 52-53 with 1:34 to go.

Hillander and Brown each hit two free throws to give the Jackets a 57-53 lead with 5:25 seconds remaining. It took Harrison County only 10 seconds to cut the lead to one, as John Dawson

canoned the long range missile and it was 57-56 Nicholas County.

The Jackets worked the ball and the clock to the 20 second mark, but Reitz fouled Kevin Morris and the junior went to the line for two shots.

Neither charity loss would fall, and the Thunderd pulled the clutch rebound.

Hillander and Brown finished with 22 points each. Sims had six, Sibert five and Jarrod Wills two.

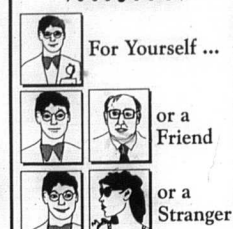
We were able to do the things to keep ourselves in the game, said NCHS Head Coach Eddie Oakley.

NOTICE TO ALL HIGH SCHOOL PARENTS: The Kentucky Education Reform Act of 1990 gives parents an official role in their children's school.

By January 1, 1991 the Local Board shall have a policy on SBDM.

All schools must implement SBDM by 1996. In order to start this process, two-thirds of the faculty of the school must vote to implement SBDM.

The following is a list of the qualifications necessary for parents to serve: A. Must have a child in the school during the time they serve.

B. Parent representatives shall not be a relative of any district employee. C. Parent members must be willing to attend training sessions preparing them for effective team efforts.

D. Parent members must be willing to work as a team and be interested in improving educational opportunities for all the children in that school.

E. Parent council members shall be a parent or legal guardian of a student currently enrolled in the school.

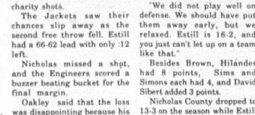
