JMHC files suit

only their official representative.
3 The Cabinet for Human Resources as part of its duties, is charged with the responsibility of drafting the State Health Plan and working with the Council for Health Services regarding the State Health Plan.

4 Robertson County Health Care, Inc., a for-profit Kentucky corporation, appeared as an affected party in opposition to the petitioner's certificate of need application.

In summary, other points shown, point out that on or about November 26, JMHC filed an application for a certificate of need to construct an addition containing 50 additional nursing facility beds in Carlisle.

On December 18, 1990, a pre-hearing conference was held and the State Health Plan to be disregarded and to require CHECK to seek new counsel due to conflict of interest issues and to declare each applicant an affected person to all other applicants.

On January 9, 1991 a hearing was held concerning the State Health Plan, and in an order dated January 11, 1991, CHECK denied all pending motions, essentially denying it had the authority to issue them.

On January 2, CHECK issued a memorandum to all long-term care applicants wherein updated need data based on 1991 population figures was provided which would be used in the review of all long-term care applications in this review cycle.

According to that data, there was a need for 52 nursing facility beds in Nicholas County.

On February 19, 1991 there was a hearing conducted on this application, with testimony produced on behalf of the petitioner's and other applicants.

Prior to the testimony of witnesses, and over JMHC's objections, CHECK introduced its exhibit number one, which showed that based on 1992 projected population figures, which was significantly different from that sent out in January. According to the new data, there is an excess of three nursing facility beds in Nicholas County.

The JMHC application was measured against certain criteria set for by Kentucky law.

Also introduced from the State Health Plan from September 1989 contained the

review criteria and standards for review of long-term care applications.
The court document also said that on April 10, 1991, CHECK issued its Hearing Report dated April 8, 1991 recommending that JMHC's application be denied finding

consistent with certain criteria for review set out by KRS, specifically Consistency with Plans and Need and Accessibility.
JMHC had no notice of additional testimony be introduced, nor was any affidavit filed 10 days from the State of the hearing report to file exceptions to the report. These exceptions are to be made part of the record.
On April 12, JMHC filed its application in order for CHECK to consider its exceptions.
On April 17, without receiving and without reviewing the exceptions, CHECK issued its final determination denying binary and capricious, clearly erroneous and denied JMHC's application based on its hearing report.
A notice of that decision was given to JMHC alleging inconsistency with certain several areas.
