Bourbon County Connie Mack won their second tournament this season at the Shelbyville American Legion Invitational Tournament. The Bourbon County Connie Mack team has five players from Carlisle: Jared Wills, Travis Sims, Kevin Morris, Mike Cain and Daniel Brown. Travis Sims was hot at the plate going 10 for 13 for the tournament. Bourbon beat everybody in their division and went on to beat Louisville in the championship game. On Thursday they played Storm Club out of Cincinnati who recruits players from Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, and anywhere else they can find the players they want. John Tubbs was on the mound for the locals.

Tubbs gave up one run which was unearned, struck out 5, and allowed only 3 hits. Bourbon started their bats early when Adams led off with a single, Wright singled and Sims singled to score Adams. Bourbon scored 4 more times in the fourth inning. The Wills walked, Tubbs singled, Adams singled, Wright walked, Lakes singled, and Sims doubled. Bourbon went on to win 5-1.

Daniel Brown came in to relieve Ferrell midway through the fourth inning. Bourbon's big inning came in the fifth as they scored 8 runs. Darryl Morgan led off with a walk, Ben Wright walked, David Lakes singled, Travis Sims singled, Daniel Brown walked, Jarrod Wills walked, and John Tubbs singled.

Daniel Brown allowed 1 more run the rest of the way and picked up the 13th win. This put Bourbon in the championship against Louisville. Daniel Brown started the game on the mound retiring the first 2 batters, but then an error and a hit scored a run. In the bottom of the first inning Travis Sims blasted his third homerun of the tournament to put Bourbon ahead 2-1. Louisville scored 3 more runs in the second inning.

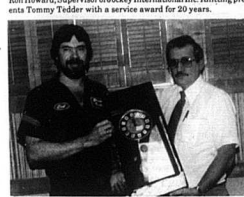

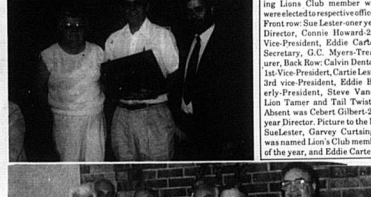


Lions Club meets
