Mercury Staff Report CARLISLE — Storms swept through Nicholas County, as well as all of Kentucky, Monday, as high winds and intense lightning caused damage in many areas. Gene Kelley, who keeps daily records of rainfall, said that from 9 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. the group he uses shows 3.0 inches fall, while the county received an additional 8-tenths of an inch from 2:30 p.m. until 7:30 Tuesday morning.

Rainfall totaling as much or more than that recorded by Kelley were reported throughout Nicholas County. Nicholas County suffered from brief flash flooding in the county, some trees were leveled from high winds and heavy rain. 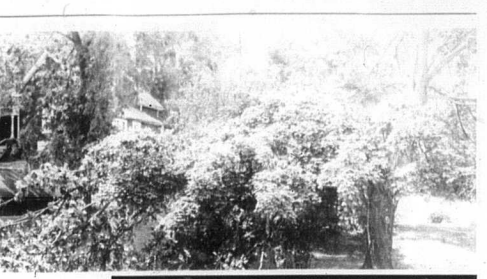

Continued From Page 1 The board acknowledged the receipt of required notification from Nicholas County Superintendent Caber Gilbert regarding the hiring of James Haman, an secondary social studies teacher with a one year probation and Suzanne Dutton as science teacher at the school.
