PUBLIC NOTICE
The Nicholas County School District has recently prepared an application for the use of federal funds for the education of pre-school handicapped children in the Nicholas County School District. This application specifies that a free and appropriate public education will be provided to all handicapped students age four through twenty-one who are residents of the Nicholas County School District. Public Law 91-142 provides for priorities for the expenditure of funds. First priority is given to children who are not receiving any educational services. It also requires that the school district plan for the implementation of identification, location, evaluation and placement of all handicapped children. Guaranteed procedural safeguards for handicapped children and their parents in the decisions regarding educational programs and confidentiality of files of those children identified as handicapped will continue to be instituted. This application is on file in the Office of the Director of Special Education for the Nicholas County Schools for a period of thirty days beginning on June 6, 1991 and ending July 5, 1991. Any interested person may review copies of this application and make comments to Carol Gilbert, Jr., Superintendent of the Nicholas County School District. Consideration will be given to all comments prior to submission of the final copy of the application on July 5, 1991.
