**1991 Distinguished Service Awards**

Jockey International, Inc. of Carlisle celebrated employees day Saturday, June 1 with a picnic and again Wednesday, June 5 with a free lunch for employees and a program on their grounds. Donna Wolf Steigerwald, chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Jockey International, Inc., presented the 'Jockey Distinguished Service Award' to Juanita Scott of the Carlisle Sewing Plant and to Henry Peters of the Knitting Plant on Wednesday, June 5. Other Jockey International staff on hand during this presentation included William Steigerwald, Ron Christman, regional vice president, Don Haney, vice president of Kentucky sewing operations, Bascom Sorrell, plant manager of the Knitting Plant, and Tim Brown, plant manager of the Sewing Plant. Also, there were over 130 new employees in the Carlisle Sewing plant since the last awards day.

The 'Jockey Distinguished Service Award' is the most prestigious award a company employee may receive. The award is given in recognition for an individual's significant contribution in perpetuating the 'Jockey ideal' reflecting the best in a person's commitment to loyalty, integrity and service and the dedication with which one conducts his or her daily life. All employees, salaried and hourly (not including division vice presidents) are eligible for this award. Employees in each location nominated candidates for this year's recipients.

A plaque recognizing the recipients will be placed in a prominent area in each plant. A personalized certificate is presented to each individual receiving this award. The golden Jockey statue with the individual's name inscribed thereon is also presented along with a check for \$250 net in cash.

An additional contribution from Jockey in the amount of \$250 will also be made to that person's church or favorite charity. A total of 10 awards are given each year, one at each of the following Jockey facilities: Jockey Office Personnel, which includes, Kenosha Office, New York Office, Los Angeles Office and all outlet stores; Kenosha Manufacturing and Distribution Center Award; Belmont Manufacturing; Milnes Manufacturing; Mount Sterling Manufacturing; Cynthia Manufacturing; Carlisle Knitting; Carlisle Manufacturing; Mayville Manufacturing; Cedar Falls Manufacturing Company; The Jockey Distinguished Service Award may not necessarily be presented every year.

Bascom Sorrell was hired June 20, 1966 to help set up the knitting plant. At the time he was employed, there were no machines in the knitting plant and he cleaned floors and worked on getting the building ready for the arrival of the machinery.

As the knitting plant grew through the past 25 years, so has Bascom's career. Starting as set up in 1966, he advanced to a mechanic in a few months; was promoted to a supervisory position in 1968; became 'Director of Knitting' in 1977; and became the 'Knitting Plant Manager' in April of 1984. Bascom and his wife, Betty, also a 25 year employee who works as receptionist at the Carlisle sewing plant, reside on the Pleasant Springs Road where they raise miniature horses to show. They have one son, Jeffrey (a mechanic at Stamer in Millersburg).
