Tigers Take Over First Place
 Wednesday, June 6, found the Angels and Dodgers battling in a 14-7 victory for the Angels. Mike Booth started on the mound for the Blue Jays but Mike Houch started on the mound for the Angels but was replaced in the fourth after hurting his arm driving after a line shot back up the middle.

Israel Stacy and Mark Adams finished pitching for the winning team. The Angels produced 13 hits from J. Warner (2), M. Adams (2), B. Simpson (3), B. Small, C. Warner, W. Berry, S. Fulton and B. Day.

Bradley and John Brown combined their pitching effort for the struggling Dodgers and got half of their team's hit. Bradley got 3 hits and John got a double in the 7th inning. Others hitting for the Dodgers were W. Brudwick, A. Fryman, S. Bloomfield, and C. Allison.

On Friday, the Tigers and Blue Jays met as the Blue Jays still try to pick up their first win. The Tigers used 3 pitchers starting with Shane Kenney, followed by his brother, Duane Kenney and then John Buckler who struck out the last batter.

Bradley Burden went the distance for the Blue Jays but couldn't hold down the Tigers as they got 8 hits from B. Hunt, D. Kenney, J. Buckler (2), B. Trussell, S. Kenney, D. Trischer, C. Kelley.

The winning Tigers scored 10 runs and allowed only 6 from the Blue Jays on 2 hits from M. French and B. Burden. The Blue Jays walked 11 times.

Saturday, the Dodgers left the Blue Jays behind as they scored 14 runs and allowed only 5 from the winless Blue Jays. Brad Russell pitched the full game for the Blue Jays but his team only came up with 4 hits from M. French, J. King, B. Russell and B. Burden off Dodgers pitcher Aubrey Ryan.

The Dodger hit the ball well and got to walk 10 times to help get their victory. Hitting were: S. Bloomfield (3), B. Brown (2), M. Lane, B. Hobbs and C. Allison (2).

The Tigers took over first place as they defeated the Angels 16-2. The Angels couldn't seem to hit the ball as Brad Trussell hurled from the mound for the Tigers. The only hit he allowed was from J. Warner, J. Stacy, W. Berry and M. Booth (2).

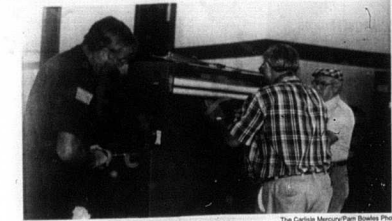
