are private citizens who are not holding their breath.

Knowing their constituents, the legislators and Cabinet representatives even included in the bill a system of resolving conflicts within and among solid waste management districts through the State Department of Local Government.

Besides the recycling authority, the legislation creates three other committees to study and make recommendations on issues relevant to solid waste management.

The Solid Waste Management Legislative Task Force, made up of legislators, is charged with monitoring the bill and recommending Legislative Research Commission. This group, by law, will include six legislators and seven other citizens, representing local government, on recyclable containers, such as bottles, jars and cans, and environmental waste groups and the Natural Resources Cabinet.

The committee's task will be to review what other states have done regarding deposits on recyclable containers, such as bottles, jars and cans, and make recommendations to the Natural Resources Cabinet.

The Solid Waste Management and Management Plan Advisory will keep tabs on all aspects of the legislation. The two-year committee is to include the Natural Resources Secretary, serving as chairman, one senator, one representative, and nine persons appointed by the governor. The governor's nominees must represent cities and counties; industrial waste generators; private recycling industry; environmental industry organizations and the public at large.
