 Services for Wilbert Herndon, a former Flemingsburg police chief and city council member, will be at 11 a.m. Wednesday at Denton Funeral Home.

Mr. Denton, of 118 States Avenue, died Sunday at Fleming County Hospital, apparently of complications from a stroke. He was 85. He worked for the city police department for about 25 years, the last 16 years as chief. He retired in 1974.

Mr. Denton, whom friends called "Chief" even after he left the police department, went on to serve two terms on the Flemingsburg City Council. He was mayor one term while on the council.

He also was a former partner in Denton Funeral Home, which still is operated by members of his family.

Mr. Denton was an honorary state police officer and a member of Flemingsburg Christian Church and the Odd Fellows Lodge.

Survivors include his wife, Verge Shields Denton; a son, Fleming County Coroner Joe Denton; a daughter, Sue Flora of Flemingsburg; eight grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a son and daughter-in-law, Jimmy and Jean Denton.

Soldiers Act is improved
 A bill to improve and clarify the Soldiers and Sailors Civil Relief Act (SSCRA) has been passed by the Senate and is expected to be passed by the House with ease.

There are 200,000 National Guard members and reservists on active duty in connection with Operation Desert Storm, said Larry Arnett, Director of the Kentucky Division Veterans Affairs.

This amendment to the original Relief Act, passed in 1940, will add legal protections and clarify several provisions of this law which has not changed since 1972, concluded Arnett.
