Gaunce recalls...

"We did stay with our materials and classified boxes. Sgt. Gaunce and his wife, Brenda and their 3 and one-half year old son, Christopher, were with me. I did not have it too bad over there, but I don't think that I ever want to go back again."

"Sleep was precious. When I got off work, it was 7:00 a.m. and I was exhausted and too cold to lay out in the sun; so, I didn't."

"The sirens were a distinct sound, not like you hear the fire sirens or the ambulances here."

"CAM suits and masks were required, and at first we couldn't get them on fast enough."

"Sometimes we slept in tents. Our biggest fear was of chemicals."

"I was not in a combat unit but was close to the border. The biggest danger was the SCUDs. When the sirens went off, all of Saudi Arabia sounded alarms. You didn't know if the SCUD was going to land in the desert or if a Patriot was going to shoot it down."

"I did not see anyone from here, but I did have a reunion with some of the men I served with before."

"I got to spend Christmas Day in the hospital. I had some heart trouble but the tests CO I'd be back. And I was, I did not want to be sent home."

"The women were totally outed. Sometimes you could even see their eyes. I don't know how they walked around."

"Single men were white," he continued, as he passed around the red and white married colors. "The Keffiyah that were worn."

"They wore a skull cap under it and wrapped the rope around their heads."

"Laughter exploded as it was made in Japan. Very little is actually made in Saudi Arabia."

"A few souvenirs were got mail practically every day. I got 27 letters in one day, some from Owensville, too."

"I am sorry I could not write you all personally. But I can thank you enough for all of the letters. I think I got about 500 letters in all."

"As far as the demonstrations, that is what we saw on TV. It made me angry. We knew what we had to do and we did it."

"Everyone there had complete confidence. We were trained to do a job."

"War is what the military line, it was difficult. They were real anxious on the front line."

"I was in Jubail, Saudi Arabia when the war started. We were in tents on January 17 and the Marines really took good care of us."
