

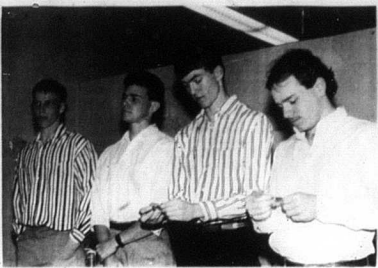
### Boosters honor boys hoopsters

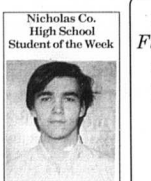

Maintaining physical fitness is important for us all and should begin at a young age. Building sound eating and exercise habits could reduce the threat of heart disease later in life.

Children as young as five and six have the same risk factors for heart disease as adults according to a study from Columbia University, said Janet Korynske, Extension food and nutrition specialist with the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.

"Results of the study revealed that boys are generally fatter than girls," Korynske said. "The fatter child had lower blood pressure."

"As an adult, boys carry most of their body fat on the trunk. Girls will carry most of their body fat on the arms and legs," Korynske said.

Fat on the trunk is related to cardiovascular disease, Korynske said.

"A study at the University of California found that children who watched more than two hours of television per day were likely to have cholesterol levels above normal," Korynske said.

"This is probably due to snacking while watching television and exercising less," she added.
