Dr. Boothe received his bachelor of science degree from the University of Missouri in Columbia, his master degree in American history from U.M. and the Ph.D. degree from the University of Illinois at Urbana.

He is chair of the Greater Cincinnati Consortium of Colleges and Universities and a member of the Governor's Commission for a Drug-Free Kentucky education committee and the Kentucky Educational Television advisory committee.

Dr. Boothe has been recognized as one of the Cincinnati Enquirer's four outstanding leaders in education in the Greater Cincinnati area. He was a member of the 1990 Leadership Kentucky class and has been honored by both his alma maters with Alumni Achievement Awards.

In addition to the commencement address, awards will be presented to graduates for academic excellence and to members of the community, MCC faculty and staff for service to education, service to MCC, Community service and faculty and staff.

"Commencement is really the high point of our academic year," said Greiner. "This joyous and special occasion marks not the ending but a beginning for our graduates."

In case of inclement weather, ceremonies will be held in the Mayville High School Auditorium with announcements made to the public as soon as possible.

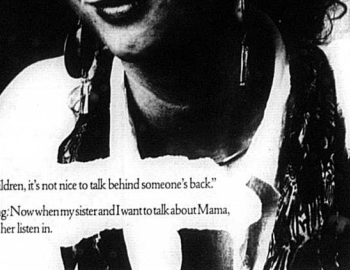
