

FmHA still providing financial assistance

The Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) still provides financial assistance to qualifying farmers, according to Stephen B. Frantz, County Supervisor in Harrison and Nicholas Counties. However, the type of FmHA assistance available is shifting from direct to guaranteed financing. The shift allows the FmHA to help more people with less money out of the National budget.

The guaranteed loan program allows farmers to continue doing business with commercial lenders for the

FmHA guaranteeing up to 95% of each loan.

A new program called "Interest Assistance" was recently announced by FmHA. This program allows FmHA to buy down up to four percent of the interest rate charged by a commercial lender for a farmer who needs the reduced cash flow requirement.

The cash flow will be reviewed annually, and the interest rate reduction adjusted accordingly.

The FmHA will continue to make direct loans to farmers who need them, but with the long range goal of shifting those accounts to the guaranteed program model. Complaints of discrimination should be sent to Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, D.C. 20250.

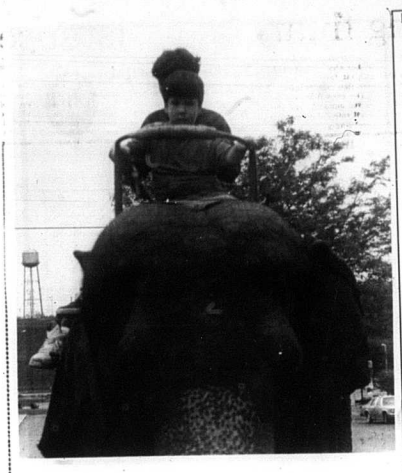
