UK HAS to bring in more dollars, Newton said because it is expanding its sports by one to 20 this fall with the addition of soccer. And that's not all soccer's soccer will be added in 1992.

So, again, Newton turns to football for additional money. But how do you do that, Newton asks, when UK hasn't been on TV money, said Newton.

"A lot of schools are hurting now for money. The University of Wisconsin, a Big Ten school is \$20 million in the hole and is dropping three sports, including outdoor baseball. The reason is that from 1984 to 1990 attendance at that football games dropped from an average per game of 74,000 fans to 50,007."

UK Among Also-rans

Let it be noted here that UK ranked seventh in home attendance in the Southeastern Conference last year — as always. The Cats drew a respectable average of 50,473 in a 57,800-seat stadium. That was better than just three other SEC schools: Ole Miss drew 48,250 and Mississippi State 30,256. In it any wonder that Vanderbilt and Mississippi State have new coaches? Gerry DiNardo takes over at Vandy and Jackie Sherrill at Mississippi State.

Tennessee, as usual, led the SEC in home attendance with an average of 50,220. Among home opponents for the Vols were Notre Dame, Alabama and Kentucky. Auburn was second in attendance with 48,625. Georgia third with 30,173. Florida fourth with 27,282. Alabama fifth with 21,583 and LSU sixth with 21,580. And please note that LSU's attendance want good enough! The Tigers also have a new coach, Curley Hallman.
