**Jackets fall in playoffs to Erlanger Loyd 35-8**

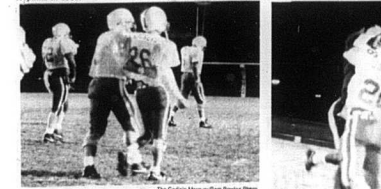

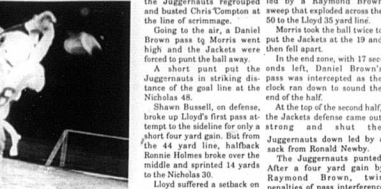

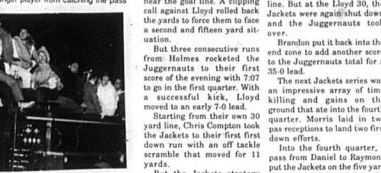

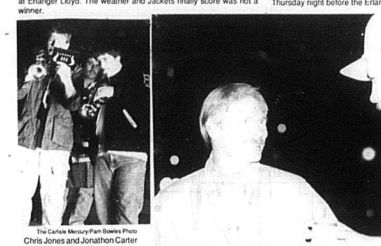
Raymond Brown stops the Erlanger player from catching the pass Friday night in football playoffs.
