Court denies industrial authority additional funds

CARLISLE — Several members of the community attended the Nicholas County Fiscal Court meeting on Tuesday morning to voice their opinions on the financial position of the Nicholas County Industrial Authority.

Cary Lester asked the fiscal court if there is any way it could reconsider giving the industrial authority any money.

Nicholas County Judge-Executive Reese Smoot said, we do not have anything against the industrial authority, but the jail budget has tripled and we just don't have the money.

"We can't spend money we don't have," said Smoot.

Charlie Gates asked to have the spending action of the industrial authority be reviewed and to tell where the funds have gone.

He said the deeds to the Bluegrass Pet Food and County Concrete were not in the deed book.

Gates asked about an audit being done on the industrial authority books and why it is in Carlisle.

John Wolfe, one of the spokesmen for the industrial authority said an audit had been done by Proctor Blair, CPA.

Kathy Howard coordinator of the Nicholas County Industrial Authority said, "It has taken time to establish Carlisle in Frankfort and to let them know that we have 42 acres of economic land ready for industry and we are constantly updated in Frankfort."

"The certified crisis has helped us in this aspect, but all the work will be lost if we can't keep the industrial authority open."

Howard said, if the industrial authority had at least \$4,000 it could stay open through the fiscal year.

Nicholas County Magistrate Darrell Stacy said, "The need for industrial authority, fire department, and senior citizens is there."

To have the ability to give everyone money which needs it we would have to raise taxes and no one wants to do that.

Smoot said, "Maybe down the road if the county is willing we could give the industrial authority some money, but we just don't have any at the present."

In other business the fiscal passed Part I for the Solid Waste ordinance. Court is going to write to the Mason County Fiscal Court to attempt to use its landfill.

The fiscal court approved the second reading of the tax ordinance and approval of an ordinance relating to the annual budget and amendment thereof.

Mrs. Lovell Hollar came before the fiscal court to ask for permission to place a plaque in the court house yard for Dr. Charles Mathers and the court approved the request.

Charles Canupp, Director of the Family Resource Center at Nicholas County Schools said, he needed a truck to deliver mattresses from the community action building on Scobers Road to needy families. He said he would only need the service approximately six times a year.

Magistrate Carl Cahorn said he would be willing to do the service for the people.

The easement on Yank Allison's property has been completed.

Jack Casley, Nicholas County Attorney said, he was going to small claims court with the delinquent rock accounts.

Magistrate Floyd Bassell asked if it would be legal to let the Nicholas County Lions Club take over running the park on a 60-40 basis. This would be on a one year to one year basis.

Bassell is concerned that its grants would be lost if the Lions Club took over.

The fiscal court didn't feel there would be a problem with the grants.

Bassell is a member of the recreational board and the board is not happy with the current situation.

Approval was made to use the Health Wise Insurance.

Smoot wants to trade out the bulldozing work the county
