 our son for transportation and we are paying about \$1.01 a mile, in addition to the drivers salary, all repair bills and the insurance coverage.

Having CATS provide the necessary transportation for the Nicholas County Senior Citizens Center, would save approximately \$7000 a year, Vice said.

"We will provide weekday transportation in the morning from the clients' designated pick-up location to the Nicholas County Senior Citizens Center and then back home in the afternoon. This provided will be the regular weekday meal deliveries to senior citizens in Nicholas County."

If group outings or shopping trips wanted to be scheduled we will provide service for those, if scheduled in advance.

By establishing a contract with CATS the mileage rate will be \$75 per loaded mile, which means whether there is one person or 10 people on the bus, it will still cost 75 cents a mile," Pack said.

All mileage will be documented by the driver and the Nicholas County Senior Citizens Center will be invoiced monthly.

"The van that the cogler has been using will cover back to the Community Action Center, Vice said.

CATS will hire a driver for the bus from this area, said Pack.

The members agreed to let CATS provide transportation for the Nicholas County Senior Citizens Center beginning October 1, 1991.

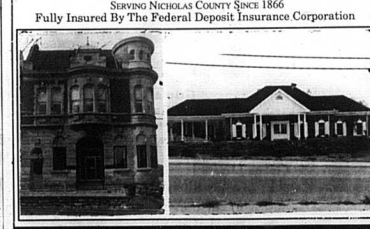
