Sexton said.

The only concern local farmers may have with the system is, of course, the initial cost to set it all up, Sexton said. For everything Sexton has used to install his filtration system, he has paid out an estimated \$23,000.

However, he said that cost involved a few extra trees farmers could avoid. A friend of his is planning to attempt the filtration system outdoors, without the use of a greenhouse. "The greenhouse, really, serves my own aim," like to see.

Voter registration books open till April 27

Voter registration books will be open until April 27. Between now and then each person who would like to vote in the May 26 primary election can register at their county clerk's office.

Also those who will be 18 or before November 3, the date of this year's general election, can be registered. In the last primary election and the general election, provided they meet the residency and other requirements. Teens may also register at their county clerk's office or check with the principal of their high school for voter registration forms and assistance.
