

NCES holds open house

CARLEME — The Nicholas County Elementary School has finally been constructed with education in mind. So said Elementary school principal Gerald Hammons at the Nicholas County school open house held last Sunday afternoon.

Nicholas County School administrators, teachers and board members, Kentucky School reform leaders, and members of the engineering and construction firms who designed and built the bus

garage and elementary school addition were hosts to nearly 700 people gathered to view the new improvements to the school campus.

The program, which featured a presentation from students and band, was designed to allow people to come and ask questions regarding the series of changes which have very nearly altered the face of Nicholas County's school system.

Presentations were made by Nicholas County School

superintendent Cabert Gilbert and School Board chairman Louise Zachary, who invited all people to ask questions about the new facilities.

However, it was Hammons' impromptu speech before the hundreds gathered in the gymnasium that summed up the sense of accomplishment.

"If you had ever been in this building before it had walls, when students were trying to learn in a nearly impossible atmosphere," Hammons said. "Though he admitted that even now space to fit all students and all rooms are still cramped, the conditions for learning at the elementary school are better than they ever have been."

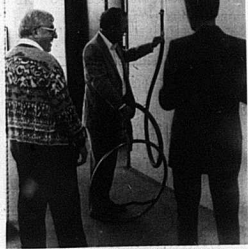
He urged those attending to support efforts to continue working on improving and expanding the school facilities and quality of offerings.

As special programs from the students concluded, people were allowed to visit classrooms, the bus garage, and even tour a special bus designed to introduce people to every facet of Kentucky's new education reform package.
