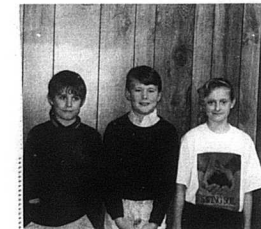

**Police report about carpet scams**

In the continuing series of articles about fraud and scams, Detective Ron Harrison, Kentucky State Police, explains how the Carpet Scam operates. All the scams which will be discussed over the next several weeks are worked by well organized groups from North and South Carolina. They will be driving newer model Chevrolet or GMC pickup trucks, usually white or light blue in color. Generally, the Carpet Scam is worked by two people and they will primarily target the elderly. The scam artists will approach a home and usually start the conversation by telling the potential victim that they are going to start a business in the county that the victim will recognize. This is done to put the victim at ease. They may tell the home owner that he is being contacted as a promotional customer and he will be able to carpet his home at a very nominal cost. They may even offer the owner the carpet free if he agrees to show it occasionally to future customers. They may tell you they are having potential customers contact you about your satisfaction of the carpet. Some time during the conversation the scam artists will produce a 4 foot by 8 foot piece of carpet. They will talk about quality, texture and color. In other words it would appear that they are actually trying to sell you. As these people are leaving they will start to steal anything that is small and valuable such as money, jewelry or blank checks. They will try to isolate the victim from the rest of the house by using the excuse that the light may be better in another room or if you are in a room that the rest of the house is inaccessible, they will start the light demonstration there. At this point the piece of carpet will be used as a shield in front of the doorway to the room you occupy. While the person demonstrating the carpet continues his spiel, the second person methodically rummages through the rest of the house looking for valuables. Of course there are several variations of this scam but they are basically the same. Sometimes the conversation is used to evaluate the situation if they cannot isolate you in a room and to get your mind off of the second person. It is important to note that once the scam artists are in the house, before they leave something will be stolen. In order for these people to work their scam, they must get inside your home and they dominate the conversation. To throw their rhythm off there are several techniques you can use. First do not allow them to install your name next tag for identification and legitimate information about their business. Next ask them to return when it is convenient for you. If they are a legitimate business they will be more than happy to return.

**Court approves tentative jail budget**

**CARLSLE** — The Nicholas County Fiscal Court approved the tentative jail budget on Tuesday night in a special meeting. The total of the new budget is \$130,017 where last year's budget was \$100,757. Nicholas County Judge Executive Reese Stoot said the difference in contracts with other counties this year. The tentative budget had to be approved by the first of April. Stoot said the National Guard has decided to trade foot for foot for land. The National Guard will take the additional land behind its building and the county will take the land next to the hospital, which belongs to the National Guard. Stoot said it has been surprised, but he has not gotten the copy at this time. The court approved the sheriff settlement. The court also approved the ambulance service, motor vehicle fuel, road oil, and asphalt blacktop coming from the administrator for the Wash Water District to work on lines on Locust Grove, Hwy. 32 and East Union.
