 Starting and stopping often, temperature at which gasoline ignites, is much higher. In winter, however, gasoline is much easier to spark, or ignite, has a lower flash point. Problems are most likely to occur in the spring where temperatures are subject to radical change, Parks said. Therefore, investigators theorized that it is at least probable that, due to the warm temperatures, combined with the interior temperature of the engine, the fire may have been produced. "Usually, that sort of occurrence happens when buses are on normal school routes," Parks said.
