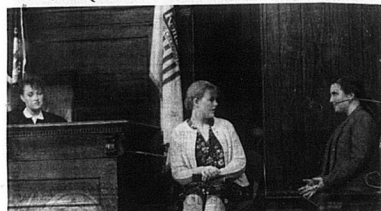

Kindergarten registration to be held April 17

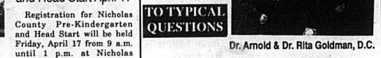
Registration for all kindergarten students eligible for the kindergarten program in Nicholas County Schools will be held from 9 a.m. until noon, Friday, April 17, at Nicholas County Elementary School.

To be eligible for entry, the child must be 5 years old on or before October 1, 1992. A child is not required to enroll in kindergarten at age 5; however, the child is required to attend a kindergarten program prior to entry into the first grade.

To register, parents must provide a state copy of the child's birth certificate, social security card, TTI certificate, proof of medical examination, and a certificate of immunization.

Rabies season has arrived

CHARLIE - As Kentucky enters its peak annual rabies season, the Nicholas County Health Department is reminding Nicholas County residents to make sure their dogs and cats are vaccinated and to take precautions around wild animals.

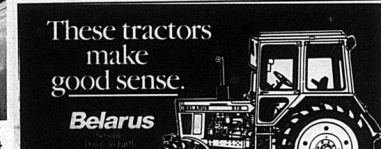
Larry Trussell, Sanitarian of the Nicholas County Health Department, says that although rabies in humans is rare, Kentuckians reported 3,584 animal bites last year, putting these people at risk.

"Humans can catch rabies if bitten or scratched by a wild animal," Trussell said. "That's why it's extremely important that all dogs and cats have the proper shots and that people avoid contact with wild animals."

In 1991, the state Department for Health Services laboratory reported that 50 animals tested positive for rabies. Skunks (31) accounted for 44 percent of the positive. Other animals testing positive were six dogs, four cats, four bats, three raccoons, one horse and one raccoon.

The requested tests performed by the state detect only a fraction of actual cases statewide. The environmentalist offers the following guidelines for protecting your family and yourself from potential rabies:

- Avoid contact with wild animals, especially skunks, foxes, bats and raccoons.
- Wild animals, such as raccoons and ferrets, and hybrids, such as wolfing mixes, should not be kept as pets.
- Vaccinate your dogs and cats against rabies. Pets can be vaccinated by a private veterinarian, or by the Nicholas County Health Department's rabies vaccination clinic.
- Avoid contact with obviously ill animals and report wild - certain cases are infectious.
