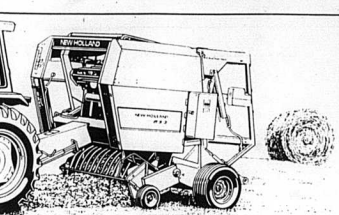

Council hears first budget reading

CARLSLE - The key word for the first reading of the City of Carlisle's proposed budget for the 1992-93 fiscal year is streamline and cut down.

The Carlisle City Council is in a special called meeting Monday night to listen to tentative budget proposals for the upcoming fiscal year.

Most recommendations were cut back on their budgets. Most were estimated higher as a contingency against unforeseen expenditures.

The meeting between Councilmembers and the engineers revealed a plan which would reduce the cost of construction to approximately \$60,000 more.

Prior to reading of expenditures, Tapp gave council a detailed estimate of the kind of revenues they could expect.

General tax revenues appear to be on the rise, the most significant being an estimated \$20,000 in receipts of the sale of parking stickers.

As utilities and grants, Tapp quoted some fluctuations between higher revenues in some sections versus lower revenues, but they balance out to be a small gain, according to estimated totals.

Among the major expenses council faces in the coming year, the construction of a large spillway at the water reservoir dam located just off upper Jackson Road represents one of the largest expenditures council members have had to take into account, with the price tag at \$1,500,000.

Kirby said this would amount to a 20 percent increase for alternative students. Kirby said the cost for the spillway is \$1.5 million.
