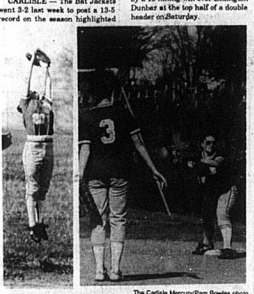

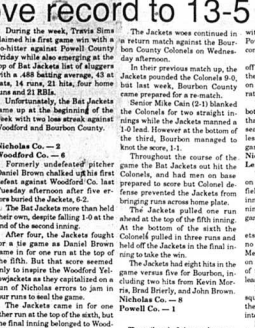
The second game between the Cubs and Dodgers was also a barn burner. The Dodgers won this game 7-5.
