

Free lunch policy announced

The Kentucky Department of Education announces the policy for free and reduced price meals for children unable to pay the full price for meals served in schools participating in the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program. Local school officials have adopted the following family size and income criteria for determining eligibility.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals, households should fill out the application and return it to the school.

Children from families whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced priced meals. Foster children may also be eligible for these meals. Families with foster children should contact the school for information regarding benefits. Additional forms are available at the principal's office in each school. The information pro-

vided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time with each school district required to verify a sample annually. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

For school officials to determine eligibility, households receiving food stamps or AFDC must list the child's name, their food stamp or AFDC case number and the signature and name of an adult household member. Households not receiving food stamps or AFDC must list child's name, names of all household members, social security number of the parent or guardian who signs the application (or an indication that neither possesses a social security number), the amount of monthly income received by each household member, identified by source, and the signature of an adult household member certifying that the information provided is correct. ORDINANCE 9, 1992

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, TO EXECUTE AN AGREED ORDER IN DIVISION OF WATER CARE NO. 9117, FOR MODIFICATIONS TO THE CARLISLE LOWER RESERVOIR DAM, AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$500.00 TO PAY A CIVIL PENALTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor, on behalf of the City, be and hereby is authorized and directed to execute an Agreed Order, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, with the Secretary of Environmental Protection, in Division of Water Care No. 9117, for modifications to the Carlisle Lower Reservoir Dam.

SECTION 2. That the sum of \$500.00 be and hereby is appropriated from the unexpended fund balance in the Utility Fund to an account to pay a \$500.00 civil penalty and such Agreed Order.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2, 1992

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 52.05 RELATING TO TRASH CONTAINERS, AND SECTION 52.06 RELATING TO PLACEMENT OF TRASH CONTAINERS FOR COLLECTION, AND CREATING A NEW SECTION OF 52 RELATING TO NONCOMPLIANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE:

SECTION 1. That Section 52.05 of the Code of Ordinances be and hereby is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

SECTION 52.05 TRASH CONTAINERS.

"Trash, except leaves, shall be placed in fly-proof and water-proof containers with tight-fitting covers and of a size which can be conveniently handled. Leaves may be placed in a paper-type box. Brush, cuttings from trees, and other garden or tree cuttings, may be bundled in not more than four (4) foot lengths, tied with string, and not weighing more than forty (40) pounds.

SECTION 2. That Section 52.06 of the Code of Ordinances be and hereby is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

SECTION 52.06 COLLECTION PLACE.

"Containers shall be placed at the curb or most accessible collection place, not sooner than sundown the day before the collection date, and shall be removed therefrom same date on which they are emptied not later than sundown the day after collection.

SECTION 3. A new section of Chapter 52 be and hereby is enacted to read as follows:

"Failure of any person to comply with Sections 52.05, or 52.06 shall be sufficient cause for collectors to refuse to collect such person's trash, and disposition by private means shall be promptly effected by the responsible person at his own expense."

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE 8 - 1992

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 35.05 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO INCREASE THE SUM PAID VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS BY \$3.00 PER RUN, FROM \$11.00 TO \$14.00 PER RUN FOR THE FIRE CHIEF AND ASSISTANT FIRE CHIEF, AND FROM \$17.00 TO \$20.00 FOR EACH FIREFIGHTER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE:

SECTION 1. That Section 35.05 of the Code of Ordinances be and hereby is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

SECTION 35.05 COMPENSATION.

"The Fire Chief shall be paid in the sum of \$65 per month and the Assistant Fire Chief shall be paid in the sum of \$55 per month with and both the Fire Chief and Assistant Fire Chief getting 211 shall be paid the sum of \$14 per run. Each firefighter of the Fire Department shall be paid the sum of \$13 \$20 for each run made by the Department, payable monthly, and each firefighter shall be paid \$22 for a fire meeting each month that is attended for traveling expenses.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
