Fourth, research and design to make modular out of Styrofoam and wood blocks for design of race cars.
"Simons said he would be able to begin education in basic home maintenance, mass production, and transportation out of his own budget.
"School Board members agreed that the agriculture and industrial arts departments deserved their equip-

ment purchases because neither department had requested any equipment in several years.
The school board accepted the assistance of technology funds in the amount of \$41,461 from the School Facilities Construction Commission (SFCC) to subsidize the superintendent to open a separate account for these funds and to have all SFCC money de-

posited in that account.
Bill Guthrie, Director of Federal Programs said the state had asked the school to make a list of how the technology money should be used.
The first priority was instruction at the high school, then instruction at the elementary, administration at the elementary, and, as last priority, administration at the central office.
Guthrie said he did not know at this time how the state will use the technology grant. The state, Guthrie said, allows school systems to use SFCC money for technol-

ogy renovation of outdated systems in existing schools if it is not used for the construction of a new building.
Nicholas County Superior Court Judge Robert Gilbert said any equipment can be used in the technology area which was requested, those items will be moved.

ORDINANCE NO. 810.1 DISPOSAL SYSTEMS NICHOLAS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the protection of the environment, including the protection of the ground water supply, is of vital importance to the general health and welfare of the residents of Nicholas County, Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, a substantial number of septic systems are installed in Nicholas County without proper permits, thereby posing a significant threat to the quality of the ground water supply; and
WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Nicholas County deems it to be of the utmost importance to take legal action to deter further threats to the quality of the ground water supply; and
WHEREAS, there is no adequate method currently existing to detect non-compliance with county, state, and federal law.

NOW, BE IT ORDAINED by the Fiscal Court of Nicholas County, Kentucky, as follows:

SECTION I

Definitions
"BUILDING" means any structure where any person lives or where people assemble for the purpose of business, government, education, religion, entertainment, or residence, including, but not limited to, structures permanently affixed to real estate as well as mobile homes and trailers.

SECTION II
No electrical inspector shall issue an order for permanent electric service to any newly constructed or newly located building unless and until the owner of such building shall furnish the electrical inspector a "Proof of Septic Systems Installation and Approval Certificate" from the Nicholas County Health Department.

SECTION III
All electrical inspectors in Nicholas County shall retain a copy of the Proof of Septic Systems and Installation and Approval Certificate and shall maintain a file for the orderly storage and retrieval of the copy. Said file shall constitute a part of the business records regularly maintained by said electrical inspectors.

SECTION IV
Temporary electrical service customarily furnished by an electrical utility company during the construction phase of the building is and shall be exempt from the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION V
It is the intent of this Ordinance to aid the Nicholas County Health Department in enforcement of the provisions of Kentucky Revised Statutes relating to on-site sewage disposal. This Ordinance shall not be construed to require the owner of any building to make additional provisions for on-site sewage disposal in excess of existing legal requirements.

SECTION VI
Any electrical inspectors who violate any provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than \$10.00, nor more than \$100.00 for each offense.

SECTION VII
All ordinances, resolutions, orders, or portions thereof, in conflict with provisions herein are hereby repealed to the extent of said conflict.
