Bath County Wildcats

The Bath County Wildcats were, without question, one of the dominant teams in the district last year.

This year, with only two seniors lost from 1991 team, the quarterback and tailback, the Wildcats are heavy favorites to repeat their performance.

Bath County is sporting one of its largest collections of seniors ever assembled in the Wildcats roster, featuring 11 senior starters on defense and 10 seniors on offense. In addition, there have been more than 45 boys fill

shoulder pads for the 1992 season, more players, Ramey said, than they have had in many, many seasons.

"The team we have lined up for this year have been on the field together since the sixth grade. But because we're senior dominated doesn't mean an automatic jump to the top spot. There's no doubt we have a quality bunch of kids, but there are also a lot of teams in our district who are going to be a lot better than last year," Ramey said. "There are no guarantees for us. No one is going to lay down for us," he added.

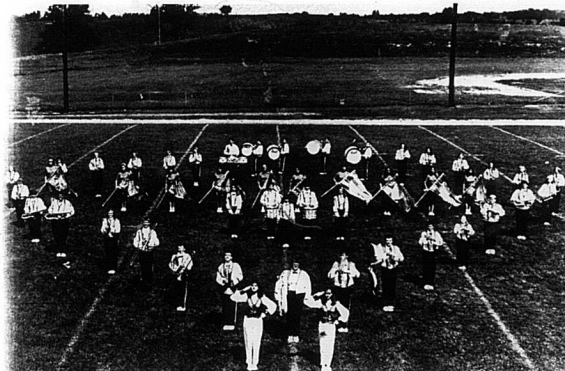
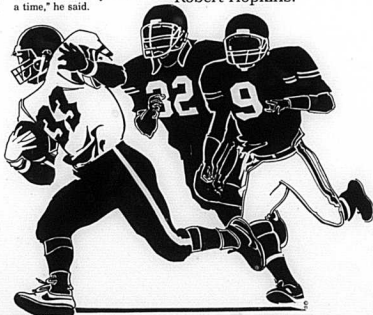
However, he feels the team's performance, a result of a continuous strength training program team members are involved in when they are not involved with other sports, has made them a bit faster and a bit stronger.
