Roads include state primary roads, bypasses, and roads with highly less traffic than A roads, he said. C roads involve state secondary roads, rural secondary roads and other roads with basically the least amount of traffic on them.

Some roads, especially small county roads, probably won't be reached very quickly if at all by state workers. County workers, however, will be active in covering grades and steep hills with cinders and salt to provide traction for cars to move.
