The Kentucky Christmas Chorus features favorite holiday tunes with added festive activities and entertainment. The doors will open at 6 p.m. with bell ringing and visits by holiday characters such as

Prosy and Santa's Elves, singers from 39 Kentucky counties participated in the chorus.

The Lexington Philharmonic, conducted by George Zerk, will provide the music. The Lexington Singers and Lexington soloists Ghelila Pumphrey and Melissa Baber will entertain and help lead the singing.

The Kentucky Christmas Chorus is sponsored by WKYT-TV, WKYT-TV, and the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government in cooperation with the Lexington Arts and Cultural Council. About 150 volunteers assist in organizing and running the event.

The Kentucky Christmas Chorus will be carried live by WKYT-TV, Channel 27, in Lexington, and WMYT-TV, Channel 57, in Hazard from 8 to 9 p.m. Last year about 102 chorals groups totaling about 4,000

Commodities given
December 16 and 17

The Community Action Council announced today that the U.S. Department of Agriculture surplus commodities including corn meal, flour, pork, raisins, peanut butter, and green beans will be distributed to eligible area residents. Amounts allocated vary according to household size. Foods and amount may be adjusted depending upon available commodities. The foods will be distributed at Senior Citizens, 124 West Main Street on Wednesday, December 16, 1992 from 8:00 - 1:30 p.m. Community Action, 149 Scrub Grass Road will distribute Thursday, December 17, 1992 from 11:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Any other permission slip will not be accepted. In order to receive commodities, you must show your Social Security or Driver's License. This is a new ruling by the State and there will be no exception. Please bring your own bookbag.

Microrepresentation of need, or sale or exchange of USDA commodities is prohibited and could result in a fine, imprisonment, or both. USDA's Emergency Food Assistance Program is available to all eligible recipients regardless of race, color, national origin, age, sex, or handicap. If it is necessary for someone to pick up your commodities, you must send with that person your Social Security card or driver's license as a form of identification. We also need a signed permission slip from you. This must be completed on the form available at Community Action. YOU MUST USE this form and this form only. Forms can be picked up at the Community Action office Monday - Friday from 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Any other permission slip will not be accepted.
