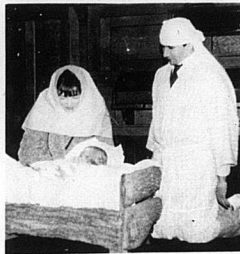

Cold weather and the ills of winter often cause desperately low levels in the blood supply. To prevent such shortages, all blood types are needed. On Monday, January 4, the Nicholas County Hospital will sponsor the next Nicholas County blood drive from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Bloodmobile at Nicholas County Hospital.

Statistics from the American Association of Blood Banks show that only five out of 100 eligible donors actually donate. If you are in good health and between the ages of 17 and 68, you are eligible to donate blood. More donors mean blood will be available when an emergency occurs. Donating involves four basic steps: registration, medical screening, donating, and relaxing with refreshments. The whole process takes only 20 to 45 minutes. That is a very little time considering the good it can do. Please help prevent shortages and save lives this winter. Donate blood on January 4.
