Mrs. Helen Watkins and son Milton of Bardston spent New Years Holiday with Rev. and Mrs. Albert Hughes and Wesley.

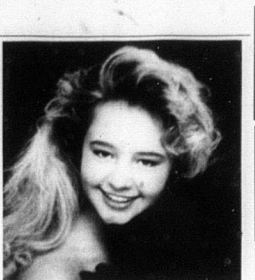
