The G.E.D. Test will be given at the Nicholas County Elementary School Testing Center beginning at 8 a.m. on each of the following dates: February 8, 1992; March 14, 1992; April 4, 1992; May 9, 1992; June 13, 1992.

The requirements for taking the test are: AE-6 application form which is picked up at the school superintendent's

office in the examinee's district, \$10.00 testing fee or an appropriate voucher, PICTURE identification. The test cannot be administered until the examinee has met these requirements.

The test will be administered to the first twenty examinees who arrive at the testing center. No appointment is necessary.
