School drops CTBS testing in favor of three prong plan

The Carlisle Mercury - Remember achievement tests? That one long spring when you brought a handful of sharpened number 2 pencils, sat at an answer sheet filled with rows upon rows of open circles, and led in the afternoon pop with the dots, Christmas trees, stars, it didn't matter.

Well, according to the Kentucky Education Reform Act (KERA) those days of pencil pushing will soon be over. In its place will be a new system, a comprehensive three part method of assessment designed not only to measure student grasp of the learning expected of them at a particular grade, but also a measure of the quality of a given Kentucky school system. Nicholas County school counselors Brenda Anderson, Betty Ballard, and Supervisor of Instruction Jane Becker are pleased that CTBS testing, which has been Kentucky's educational measuring stick for the past three years, has essentially been abandoned by KERA in favor of this more detailed and work laden method.

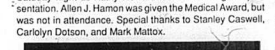
