**Local students participate in Coop-Education Program**

Neal Thomas Matzelle and Rodney D. Estep, Nicholas County residents, were among approximately 800 Eastern Kentucky University students participating in EKU's Cooperative Education Program this spring and summer.

EKU's co-op students apply principles and theories learned in the classroom to practical, on-the-job situations. Participants also receive a salary from the participating employer that may help cover college expenses. And they may earn academic credit for their work. Faculty members monitor student performance on the job and ensure that the co-op job is a rich learning experience.

Since EKU's program began in 1973, about 12,000 students have been placed with employers in Kentucky and throughout the United States. Eastern Kentucky University is a comprehensive university serving more than 16,500 students on its 330-acre Richmond campus, throughout its 22-county extended service region, and beyond.

LEXINGTON, KY. (July 16, 1992) - Central Kentucky blood center is issuing a health advisory to the public - don't bleed this summer! The community's blood supply is rapidly dwindling as donations remain critically low. CKBC is collecting an average of 785 pints of blood per week while transfusions number 930 per week. To make the difference, CKBC has zealously been bringing in blood from other blood centers around the country who have enough support in their communities to collect what they need, and have a surplus to share in emergency situations. In the last year, CKBC has had to import 6,553 units of red blood cells.

To donate blood, you must be between the ages of 17 and 68, weigh at least 100 pounds, and be in good health. Donating blood is a safe, simple process that saves lives every day. If your business, church, or civic organization would like to sponsor a blood drive in August or September, please call CKBC at 606-276-5254. CKBC has donor centers in Lexington, Prestonsburg, and Sumner along with mobile blood drives in your community.

Group 0 blood is the critical level, but all blood groups are needed. To donate blood, you must be between the ages of 17 and 68, weigh at least 100 pounds, and be in good health. 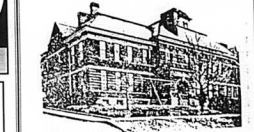
