**WIC program emphasizes breast feeding**

Although breast-feeding number of women breast-feeding on WIC is due in part to a recent emphasis in the promotion through the WIC Program, data collected over the last three years show a significant increase in the number of women participating in the Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) who are receiving up-to-date information on breast-feeding. Our staff feel able to answer most breastfeeding questions," said Peggy Seibers, Breastfeeding Promotion Coordinator for the WIC District Health Department.

Results from two different surveys show a trend in the increase of breast-feeding. In 1989, a separate survey collected through WIC indicated a definite increase in breast-feeding in 1991. This dramatic rise in the
