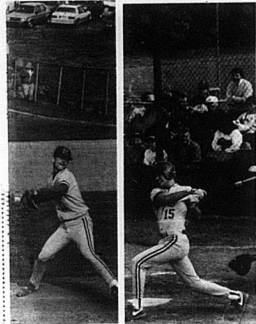

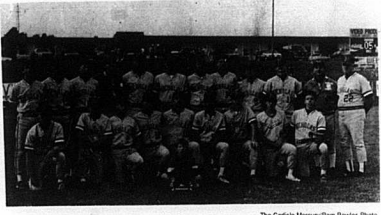

 The previous week, they lost to the same team by the same score, 5-0, in the district final.
 It was no fault of the Nicholas County defense.

Daniel Brown allowed only six hits in the game, two of which went out of the park and one of which was a home run. Brown struck out six through seven innings and the fielders kept most of Harrison's runners on first.
 Steals were something of a problem. Harrison managed to steal base four out of five times throughout the game.
 But the primary source of frustration was the fact the Jackets were held to three hits by pitcher Scott Fryman and Jackets base runners barely made second and never touched third.
 Harrison kicked off their scoring drive in their opening inning as better Shon Walker got just the right pitch for a two-run homer with but a single out against the Thorobreds.
 The Bat Jackets went down three straight in their opening inning, with the first two up striking out and Brown thrown out at first.
 At the top of the second, the Thorobreds had Brent Hampton on second before Brown burned three straight by Chris Stone to keep the score at 2-0, Thorobreds.
 Travis Sims went to base on a walk, then watched as the next three Jackets tumbled.
 The Thorobreds were given a run at the top of the third when an overthrown ball sailed into the Breeds dugout.
 The score stayed locked at 3-0 for most of the game, each time giving the Jackets a chance for a comeback. Jarrod Wills took a base hit in the fourth, but could get no further.
 Late in the bottom of the fourth, Wills, at second, fumbled a grounder but made the throw to first baseman Brian Ockerman in time for the third out at first base.
 In each succeeding inning, the Breeds put the Jackets on first base on walks, but they couldn't bring a man in for the score.
 Into the bottom of the sixth, Kevin Morris was walked to his base. A shot to the Breeds shortstop, however, called a double play against Morris and Brown.
 The seventh, despite a hit from Scott Fryman, looked as if the Jackets would be given a chance to break a 3-0 score.
 Brad Allison had two strikes against him when he found the sweet spot on the bat and knocked the ball deep into left field for the home run that buried the Jackets hopes.
 Briefly made a base hit into center field for the Jackets but hit. He stole second, but got no further. Bradley Trussell was thrown out at first and the Jackets walked away frustrated, despite a strong season and a 10th region runners-up trophy.
