Carlisle man trapped beneath farm tractor



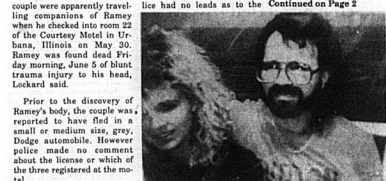
