

## Moreland appointed Jonesboro High School boys basketball coach

**Nicholas County resident has become head coach of the Jonesboro High School Boys Basketball Team.**  
 Tom Moreland, son of Carol Moreland and brother of Jeanne Dunn and Tim Moreland of Carlisle, was named coach by Jonesboro athletic director Al Hughes as the replacement for former Jonesboro boys' head basketball coach, Rick Duncan.

Duncan stepped down from his post shortly after the conclusion of the basketball season.

Moreland and new Jonesboro High Girls' basketball coach Al Surfar have three things in common: both are already employed by the high school and neither has served as a basketball head coach on the high school level, but enter the job with considerable coaching experience.

## Road improvements to begin in Nicholas County

Motivated in Mason and Nicholas Counties will soon see traveling conditions improve due to the addition of road improvement projects to the recently approved 1992 Rural Secondary Program. Transportation Secretary Don C. Kelly today said the state will provide funds for the following road improvement projects:

**Nicholas County:** \$77,898, Blackblipping Resurfacing: 2.5 miles of Upper Sharpburg Road County Road 1115.  
**Governor Jones and I are extremely pleased to announce these projects for Mason and Nicholas Counties,"** Kelly said. "Although we just recently approved the 92-93 Rural Secondary Program for Kentucky, we are moving forward with additional projects which we feel are im-

portant to the safety of travelers and to the efficiency of our Commonwealth's transportation network as a whole. We look forward to working with the local officials and residents in the area and to completing these necessary transportation improvements as soon as possible."

Each project will be funded through the state's Rural Secondary Account. Kelly explained that funds within this account are provided through gasoline tax revenues, designated by Kentucky statute, to upgrade the state's secondary road system and are allocated based on each county's land area, rural road mileage and population. All projects will be completed through the award of a contract and advertisements for bids will be released as soon as possible.

Moreland has eight years of coaching experience in Clayton County, mostly at the middle school level.

"I know a lot of people probably hoped for a big named coach from the outside to get the job, but the situation did not lend itself to that," Moreland said. "This is something I wanted to do. I guess I was in the right spot at the right time. We're going to have fun, work hard and hope for something positive."

Moreland graduated from Eastern Kentucky University in 1982 with a major in history. He earned his masters degree in guidance counseling a year later at EKU. The 1984 season was the first Moreland has spent without a coaching job since 1984.

He has coached at North Clayton Junior High, Morrow Middle School and was an assistant to Rick Moore while Mt. Zion High spent its first year of existence at Morrow Middle School.

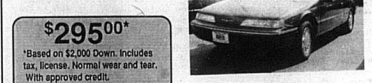
Monday evening, Moore said he first became acquainted with Moreland while serving as head coach at North Clayton High. At the time, Moreland was coaching at North Clayton Junior High.

"I have always thought a lot of Tom's basketball knowledge, but, even more, I am impressed with his ability to motivate people. Once the kids get to know him, they'll love playing for him," Moore, now the boys' head coach at Mt. Zion High, said.
