The building contains, besides the nine school rooms, a handsome and commodious chapel, capable of seating the school at one time, and all are gathered here several times each week for united exercises.

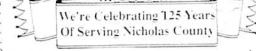
The building is fitted throughout with electric clock and bells to announce the time of recessions, and is lighted electrically. The sanitary arrangements are perfect.

Reprinted from 1900 The Pioneer Drug Store was established in 1842 by Joseph F. Tureman, grandfather of J. C. Tureman, proprietor of the drug store in 1900, with Dr. W. W. Fritts, who afterwards became one of the leading physicians of this section.

Today, under its young proprietor, it is enjoying a larger trade than at any time during its existence, and with the improvements of the day, it is keeping up with the quickest of the times.
