SECTION 1. That Section 52.04 of the Code of Ordinances

## 5 52.08 UNAUTHORIZED IMPORT AND DEPOSIT OF TRASH

No person shall bring trash into the corporate limits of the for purposes of depositing same at any authorized pick-up point, whether residential, business, or industrial location. No person shall deposit trash at any authorized pick-up point for ich he, she, or it does not pay the monthly service charge established in Section 52.04.

SECTION 3. That a new section of Chapter 52 of the Code of ordinances, 52.99, be and hereby is enacted to read as follows:

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). Each day the violation is committed or permitted to continue shall constitute a separate offense

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its ge, approval, and publication as required by law.
