 Vanlandingham and Curtisinger said.

But the problem for the northwestern edge of Nicholas County continues as of press time.

On Monday night, water line workers shut off the service valves in order to allow the Carnico tower to fill. On Tuesday, they will release the water in hopes that they may locate the source of the break.

Curtisinger estimated that if they find the water line break, residents of the affected area could see their pressure restored by either Thursday or Friday of this week, but only if they find the break, Curtisinger stressed.

Until that time, Barteville, Headquarters and Carnico residents are asked for their patience and to continue boiling their water until the advisory is officially lifted.

The E.P.A. advisory, however, does not affect residents of Carlisle.

According to Carlisle City supervisor Gayle Vanlandingham, after the problems began at Carnico, tests were run on the city water system and everything registered normal.

"No water advisory is in effect for Carlisle residents,"
