**Nicholas County's WIC program has opening for new participants**

WIC is a supplemental food program which provides nutritious foods, along with nutrition education. There is no cost to the participant, as it is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) through the Kentucky Cabinet for Human Resources.

WIC is open to all persons who are not discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, sex or handicap.

The local WIC Program currently has openings for new participants. If you would like additional information, or an appointment to apply for the WIC Program, please call the Nicholas County Health Center at 289-2188.

WIC is for pregnant, breast-feeding and postpartum women, infants, and children to five years of age. The purpose of WIC is to improve the health of its participants through good nutrition.

To qualify for WIC, you must meet income guidelines and also have a nutritional risk reason to be on the program.

Once a participant is admitted to the program, the mother receives nutrition education counseling and food instruments which are redeemable at local grocery stores.

Food available through WIC are: milk, eggs, cheese, juices high in Vitamin C, cereals high in iron, and dried beans or peas. Infants may receive iron-fortified formula, infant cereal, and infant juice.

All participants must be recertified every six months and must be a resident of the county in which they are

residing.
