**INSPECTION PERIOD FOR THE PROPERTY ASSESSMENT ROLL**

The Nicholas County property assessment roll will be open for inspection from May 11 through May 26, 1992. Under the supervision of the Property Valuation Administrator or one of the deputies, any person may inspect the assessment roll. This is the January 1, 1992 assessment on which state, county, and school taxes for 1992 will be due about September 15, 1992.

The assessment roll is in the office of the Property Valuation Administrator in the Nicholas County Courthouse basement and may be inspected between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and between 9:00 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday, May 16th, and 23rd, 1992.

Any property owner desiring to appeal an assessment on real property made by the PVA must first request a conference with the PVA or a designated deputy. The conference may be held prior to or during the inspection period.

Any property owner still aggrieved by an assessment on Real Property, after the conference with the PVA or designated deputy, may appeal to the county board of assessment appeals. The property owner can appeal the assessment by filing in person or sending a letter or other written petition stating the reasons for appeal, identifying the property and stating the property owner's opinion of the fair cash value of the property.

The appeal must be filed with the Nicholas County Clerk's Office no later than one (1) week day following the conclusion of the inspection period.

Any property owner failing to appeal to the county board of assessment appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

Appeals of Tangible Personal Property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property owners shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.

The following steps should be taken when a property owner does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the office of the property valuation administrator:

- (1) Property owner must list under protest (for certification) what they believe to be the fair cash value of the property.
- (2) Property owner must file a written protest directly with the Department of Property Taxation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.
- (3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110.
- (4) The final decisions of the Revenue Cabinet may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

**Bat Jackets take second in Woodford tournament**

**CARLSLE** — Unlike the Kentucky Derby, the finals of the Woodford County Invitational tournament between Nicholas County and Lexington Henry Clay last Saturday afternoon ended with a victory a winner.

A last gasp two run rally at the top of the seventh inning threw the Bat Jackets for a loop, but a hitter threw out on a strong 4-2 showing for the work.

Henry Clay, (21-6), ranked eighth in the state, and Nicholas County, (17-7), remained tied going into the final inning before the Lexington School managed to just the game away.

However, the Bat Jackets put up a strong showing, indicative of the roll they enjoyed through most of last week, averaging themselves at Woodford County and coming from behind with a stunning seventh inning comeback win over the Clark County Cardinals.

**Nicholas Co. — 10**  
Despite the success of the roll of the week, the Bat Jackets were forced to take a one run loss to Rowan County on Tuesday, despite a four run rally in the sixth.

Franklin started early for mound pitcher Jarrod Wills as Rowan County earned its first four runs at the bottom of the first and second innings. Meanwhile, though Nicholas garnered hits, they could manage no runs until the top of the third.

Suddenly the Jackets went on a tear as Kevin Morris blasted a grand slam homer to help take a 5-4 lead. The rally, however, was a short lived glory. Rowan wasted no time tying and then taking a two run lead at the bottom of the inning.

By the end of five, Rowan had climbed to a 10-5 lead. The Bat Jackets, however, weren't finished. Over the course of the sixth, the Jackets came in with four runs to draw 10-9 score before dropping it in the final inning. Morris brought in two hits, six RBIs including the grand slam. Brad Briery and Mike Cain followed up with two hits each.

Heading the Cardinals' comeback at the bottom of the inning, the Jackets again came back to the plate for another two run rally for the lead, highlighted by a home run from Daniel Brown.

Sims forced eight strikeouts and allowed only one base on balls. Between himself and relief pitcher Kevin Morris, they allowed Wagner only three hits in the game.

Daniel Brown had two hits and two RBIs. Sims, Jarrod Stacy, and Bradley Trussell all had two hits square.

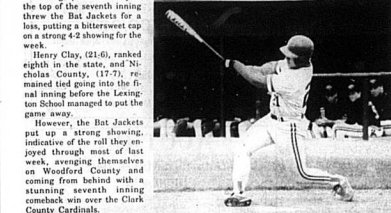
One further run at the bottom of the third capped off the Bat Jackets dominance, finishing the game with 12 total hits, scoring off all but one of them.

Jarrod Wills, Daniel Brown, and Cain shared two hits each in the semi-final game.

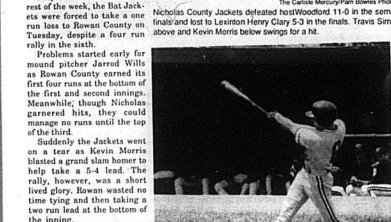
**Nicholas Co. — 3**
