Council to enforce city dumping ordinance

CARLISLE - In an apparent effort to circumvent having to pay for county-wide garbage collection, A.J. Sanitation owner Brewee Hallar said city residents continue to drop off garbage in Carlisle.

He reported the problem was starting to arise following the adoption of a new waste collection system by the Nicholas County Fiscal Court in which Hallar's trash collection bid was accepted.

In an attempt to bring some control over situation the city council drew up an ordinance prohibiting the dumping of out-

city garbage within Carlisle limits. However Hallar said he has noticed the amount of city garbage collection is increasing steadily and he has been informed by a number of city residents that county garbage is still being dropped off in town regularly.

In an effort to curb the illegal act, city council and Hallar agreed to take action. "Obviously the ordinance is being ignored," Hallar said. If it does not resolve, Hallar said he will see to it enforcement of the ordinance will begin.

In other council business: Council heard banking proposals from Deposit Bank and First National Bank. They tabled their decision on which bank they would use until the city attorney and city auditors can review the bids and give their analysis.

Accepted an audit proposal from Alan Long of Craft, Long and Co. The proposal was covered up to \$74.75 for services and was the only company to make a bid.
